

Dr. Asima Ahmad Co-Founder & Chief Medical Officer Carrot Fertility

Asima Ahmad, MD, MPH, FACOG, is Co-founder and Chief Medical Officer (CMO) of Carrot Fertility, the leading global fertility care platform. Betty Diamond Director, Institute of Molecular Medicine at the Feinstein Institutes for Medical Research Northwell Health

Betty Diamond, MD is a pioneer in the basic and clinical research of autoimmune diseases, particularly systemic lupus erythematosus. For more than four decades, Dr. Diamond has been dedicated to the study of autoantibodies, how they arise and how they affect brain function, specifically how they may contribute to changes in cognition or behavior in patients with lupus. As a scientific leader, she has committed her career to helping female investigators navigate their careers in the male-dominated – often biased – medical research arena. Dr. Diamond was elected to The National Academy of Sciences (NAS) in May 2022 for her research in molecular medicine. She was formerly president of the American Association of Immunology and served on the Board of Directors of the American College of Rheumatology and the Scientific Council of the National Institute of Arthritis and Musculoskeletal and Skin Diseases (NIAMS). Dr. Diamond is also a fellow of the American Association for the Advancement of Science (AAAS) and a member of the National Academy of Medicine. Dr. Diamond graduated with a BA from Harvard University and an MD from Harvard Medical School. She has headed the rheumatology divisions at Albert Einstein School of Medicine and at Columbia University Medical Center. She is the director of the PhD and MD/PhD programs of the Donald and Barbara Zucker School of Medicine at Hofstra/Northwell.

Dr. Hill-Briggs, PhD, was on faculty at the Johns Hopkins School of Medicine for 22 years and was the 201st woman to be promoted to full professor. In 2021, she transitioned to Northwell Health as the Vice President of Prevention and was also the Simons Distinguished Chair in Clinical Research at the Donald and Barbara Zucker School of Medicine and an associate director and professor within the Institute of Health Systems Science at Feinstein Institutes for Medical Research.

Her expertise was in the design of individual- and system-level interventions to prevent and improve the management of diabetes and other chronic diseases, with a particular focus on populations disproportionately experiencing health inequities. A key piece of her legacy is the ADA-recognized DECIDE Self-Management Support Program, which was initially designed to support diabetes self-management. The DECIDE program has improved medication adherence and self-management behaviors, has been adapted to improve outcomes across four chronic conditions, and continues to expand.

Dr. Hill-Briggs published more than 80 peer-reviewed publications and has spoken at numerous scientific forums, nationally and internationally. She is an elected member in the National Academies of Medicine and Science, Engineering, and Medicine (NASEM).

Rasmussen Nationwide Foundation Endowed Chair in **Genomic Medicine** Professor of Pediatrics at **The Ohio State University College of Medicine**

Elaine Mardis, PhD is co-Executive Director of the Steve and Cindy Rasmussen Institute for Genomic Medicine at Nationwide Children's Hospital and holds the Rasmussen Nationwide Foundation Endowed Chair in Genomic Medicine. She also is a Professor of Pediatrics at The Ohio State University College of Medicine. Dr. Mardis is an internationally recognized expert in cancer genomics and immunogenomics, with more than 550 published manuscripts. Her early work contributed to the Human Genome Project, considered one of the greatest scientific feats in history. She co-led the effort to sequence and analyze the first cancer genome using massively parallel sequencing technology and was integral to large-scale cancer genomics discovery projects including The Cancer Genome Atlas, and the Pediatric Cancer Genome Project. Her ongoing research interests pursue integrated molecular characterization of both pediatric and adult cancers with a focus on precision oncology. She leads an NCI-funded study that performs clinical molecular profiling of pediatric cancers which has tested more than 2500 cases to-date. Dr. Mardis serves as an advisor to international cancer centers including the DKFZ (Germany), Institute for Molecular Medicine (Portugal), Ontario Institute for Cancer Research (Canada), and four US NCI-designated cancer centers. In 2019, Dr. Mardis was elected a Fellow of the American Association for Cancer Research and a member of the U.S. National Academy of Medicine.
